



A step back in time

The Red Bluff contingent of the Reenactors of the American Civil War will bivouac on the west side of Habert Park in full dress and costume at the 32nd Annual Tehama County Museum Jubilee on Saturday, September 7, in the City of Tehama.

The Reenactors camp will bring to life a part of one of the most difficult periods in American history during the daylong event. Rick Barram, the group's education representative, invites anyone with an interest in and/or a passion for the Civil War to swing by and let the Reenactors share their knowledge – regiments, armaments, strategy, clothing, qualifications and requirements of personnel, hardships and living conditions – they can speak to it all. The Reenactors in the field will be complemented by the Museum's Civil War exhibit created by Pam Britting, TCM director and associate curator, and displayed in the Marty Graffell Annex. It was premiered earlier this year at the Red Bluff State Theater in conjunction with Linda McCay's Shasta College Humanities through Film class, the Heritage Film Festival and the showing of the classic movie "Gone with the Wind."

Tehama County Museum board member Paul Quinn noted that, "The Museum's annual Jubilee is the main fund raising event of the TCM. We provide a wide range of attractions, from antique trucks in the park to wonderful entertainment to rides in a 'Tin Lizzy' to a very interesting showing of Red Bluff sculptor Jay Murphy's work – and lots more. We invite everyone to come early and enjoy a pancake breakfast served up by the Central Tehama Kiwanis and then make a day of it. Breakfast service starts at 8am and our final raffle drawing is at 2:30 in the early afternoon."
