

TCM Jubilee looms for Sept. 7th

An antique loom is being readied for duty as a featured attraction at the 32nd annual Tehama County Museum Jubilee to be held Saturday, September 7, 2013, at the Tehama County Museum on C Street in the beautiful City of Tehama.

The fully operational loom will be part of a fiber arts "how to" display and will be one of several attractions housed in the Marty Graffell Annex. Other venues include: Judy's Country Store featuring homemade and handmade goodies; Sam Kissee's hand selected team of antique appraisers; a TCM Civil War display showing the Tehama County connection; Jay Murphy's display of whimsical and interpretive sculpture and paintings; TCM's thematic exhibit titled "Branding Tehama 'Country'... the olde fashioned way;" and historian Alice Jackson signing her new book "Black Pioneers in Tehama County California History."

"Tehama County has a rich and colorful past," Darrell Mullins, museum curator, said, "and our mission is to tell that story in an interesting and informative way so that those who visit us can better understand the present and imagine the future.
